## Annual Report 2023



Dear Friends community,

Thank you so much for helping us increase our impact in building community for children and youth in foster care and helping them thrive.

In 2023, we more than doubled the number of children we served through just our Expanding Horizons (general support) and It's Your Birthday! Programs from 2022. We also launched two new programs - Piggy Bank connecting foster youth to financial literacy and access to banking, and Community Building in the Community with eight events (in Albuquerque, Mountainair, and Gallup) for foster families to come together and have new experiences in our community at no cost to them. This year, we were able to serve children in 19 different counties; we look forward to reaching foster children in all of New Mexico's counties.

Volunteers helped us assemble over 200 birthday boxes and gathered numerous in-kind donations, including supplies like cake mix, frosting, candles, and decorations, to help make birthday celebrations even more special. We are excited to be expanding our volunteer program in 2024 with opportunities for volunteers to receive more training and to engage with families at outreach/community events.

I'd like to invite you to join us in celebrating our 15th birthday as a non-profit in 2024. Recurring donations, corporate sponsorships, or community connections are all on our birthday list. ## Expanding H-o-rizons

In 2023, we fulfilled 70 Expanding Horizons requests, more than double the number (30) we did in 2022. The awards included dance, gymnastics, and martial arts classes; musical instruments; travel funds; bikes; and equipment/supplies to start a business (lawn service and jewelry making). 
We fulfilled 40 Summer Fun requests. Feedback from recipients/foster families:
